WHAT IS A HEALTH IMPACT ASSESSMENT?

HIA – is a systematic process that determines positive and negative effects of proposed projects, policies or programs allowing decision-makers to understand and consider unintended health effects alongside environmental, economic and technical components.

PLACEMAKING

IS THE PROCESS OF CREATING A BUILT ENVIRONMENT. IT FOSTERS COMMUNITY, STIMULATES INTERACTION, ENCOURAGES ENTREPRENEURSHIP, SUPPORTS INNOVATION AND NURTURES HUMANITY.
