## 1/4 of waste going to landfill could be recycled or composted


Yes, you read right. About ¼ of what the average Nanaimo Household sends to landfill is not actually garbage.

This is equivalent to 1,000 tonnes of garbage going to the dump every year that could have been recycled or composted instead. The cost of land filling this non-garbage is \$125,000 annually! But it's not just a financial cost; if this waste were to be recycled or composted not only would we prolong the life of the regions landfill but we would also reduce green house gas emissions by 800t Co2e (equivalent to taking about 170 cars off the road every year).

What's really important is that you can start making a difference now. Choose to become "King of your Can" and "Queen of Green" in your household. A small change in your home will make a big difference across the City!

"The waste needlessly land filled each year is enough to fill Swy-a-lana Lagoon" The RDN said they wanted to divert 75% of the waste going to the land fill in 2011 they have reached 70%. By Recycling we can sustain the planet longer and create usable resources

### Composting Guide

As you may well already know the City of Nanaimo has been requesting that all residential location start to use The Green Bin Program . We have designed a program for our Strata clients. By participating you will reduce the amount of waste going to our landfill and help improve our environment. Participating is as easy as following the simple steps in this guide. Your efforts will help achieve the city goal of diverting 75 percent of waste from the landfill, and leading the way in BC and Canada.

### Moving Beyond Composting

The program goes beyond what can be composted at home by accepting cooked food. meat, fish, bones, and food soiled paper and paper packaging such as waxed fast food cups and milk cartons. Instead of going to the landfill, compostable household organic material is converted into value-add resources- compost, nutrient-enriched soil and eventually renewable fuels.

### Getting Started.....

Today you received your kitchen catcher, 2 compostable liner bags to try, and this pamphlet on what is compostable and what is not.

Approved compostable bags designed to breakdown in composting facility are sold at most major grocery and hardware stores and other retailers throughout Nanaimo and Victoria. Bags must have one of the following symbols on them.

When the bag is full you would tie it in a knot and take it down to the location of your waste bins and put them into the larger green totes that say Organic on them. Pick up day is to be de-

### Helpful hints in Odour reducing...

Wash kitchen catcher often.

Keep meat, fish, poultry or bones in freezer in compostable bag until the day you know the Larger totes will be picked up

Line bottom of kitchen catcher with paper towel so any condensation that happens

### No Plastics such as

- Plastic bags and Wrap
- Plastic straws and creamers,
- Bread clips or ties
- Styrofoam trays and packaging Plastic liner bags (cereal, cracker, chips,
- Cookies, pet food etc.
- Biodegradable or degradable bags

### No Metals such as

- Foil wrap, pouches and pie plates
- Foil butter or food wrap
- Metal cans, hangers, twist ties

### Other Materials such as

- Yard and garden waste
- Glass jars
- Drink boxes, juice and other Tetra Pak containers
- Make-up remover pads, cotton swabs and balls Dental floss, rubber bands
- Diapers, baby wipes, feminine hygiene products
- Textiles, dryer sheets and lint Cigarettes and butts
- Vacuum contents and bags
- Pet feces or cat litter





# Items that do not go in the recycling.



### **ACCEPTED**

### Packaging and printed paper accepted for recycling

- Newspapers, inserts, flyers, catalogues, magazines, telephone books
  - Place loose in container. Remove from plastic wrap.
- Household paper, paper gift wrap, greeting cards
- Boxboard boxes
  - Remove liners and food. Flatten and place in recycling container.
- Moulded boxboard for egg cartons, beverage carry-out trays, etc.
- Paper bags with single and multiple paper or plastic layers for pet food, flour, etc.
- ✓ Plastic garden plant pots and seedling trays

Cores from paper towel and toilet tissue

Staples and tape OK. Flatten boxes.

Remove plastic wrap from cardboard flats.

Place shredded paper in a securely-tied

Shredded paper

- Plastic pails, less than 25L, for laundry detergent, pet food, etc.
- Plastic or paper take-out cups, bowls, and lids
- Cartons for soup, milk, sauces, ice cream, etc.
- Metal cans and lids for food
- Empty aerosol cans and caps
- Microwavable bowls and cups
- Spiral wound cans and lids for frozen juice concentrate, chips, etc.
- Aluminum foil wrap, aluminum foil take-out containers
- ✓ Plastic bottles, jugs, jars, tubs, and trays
- ✓ Caps, tops, lids, and pumps
- Rigid plastic clamshells for baked goods, fruit, eggs, etc.

#### REMEMBER:

- ✓ Empty and rinse containers; labels OK.
- Remove caps, pumps and lids; place loose in container box.
- Put metal lids inside cans and squeeze slightly.
- Return deposit containers for refund.

### **ACCEPTED**

 Clear and coloured non-deposit glass bottles and jars

#### REMEMBER:

✓ Return deposit containers for refund.

- Plastic bags for groceries, dry cleaning, bread, newspapers, and flyers
- Bags for produce, pre-washed salad, dry bulk foods, and frozen vegetables
- Outer bags for diapers, feminine hygiene products, paper towels, tissues, soft drink can flats.
- Bags for water softener salt, wood pellets and garden products
- Overwrap on mattresses, furniture and electronic equipment

### REMEMBER:

- Empty bags of paper receipts and food residue.
- Cut off or remove metal grommets, rope drawstrings and non-plastic items from plastic bags.
- Stuff into one bag and tie closed

- Foam food containers and trays
- Foam cushion packaging used to protect electronics, small appliances, etc.

#### REMEMBER:

- Remove food residue and liquid-absorbing pads.
- Remove labels, tape, paper, cardboard
- ✓ Separate coloured and white foam.

### **NOT ACCEPTED**

### Please do NOT include these with recycling

- \* Plastic bags used to cover newspapers/flyers
- \* Rubber bands
- \* Hardcover or paperback books
- \* Paper towels, napkins, tissues
- \* Non-paper gift wrap, e.g. foil, ribbons, bows
- \* Musical cards with batteries

- \* Padded envelopes
- Boxes with wax coating, e.g., grocery shipping boxes
- \* Bags with a foil layer, boxes with a foil liner

- # Glass or foam containers
- \* Plastic bags and overwrap
- \* Straws, non-paper insulating wraps
- \* Foil-lined cardboard containers and lids
- \* Microwavable bowls with metal rims
- \* Propane tanks or cylinders
- Containers for paint, motor oil, vehicle lubricants, pesticides or antifreeze products
- \* Aerosol cans with any contents remaining
- \* Chip or foil bags
- \* Foil wrap with paper, e.g. butter, cigarettes
- Stand-up pouches
- \* Liquid absorbing pads

- \* Kitchen stretch wrap
- Soft packaging for perishable foods, e.g., meat, poultry, fish, cheese, etc.
- Blister packs, e.g., plastic/foil packaging for chewing gum and pills or plastic/paper packaging for batteries, toothbrushes, etc.
- Packaging labelled biodegradable or compostable
- Ceramic pots, lawn edging, tarps, plastic furniture or garden hoses, string or rope
- \* Toys
- × Pails larger than 25L
- Coat hangers, pots, pans, baking trays, appliances, hardware, or other scrap metal
- × Wiring, metal cords, or extension cords

### **NOT ACCEPTED**

Drinking glasses, dishes, cookware, window glass, mirrors, ceramic products

- Crinkly cellophane wrap, e.g. for tea, floral arrangements
- \* Kitchen stretch wrap
- Soft packaging for perishable foods, e.g. meat, poultry, fish, cheese, etc.
- Zipper-lock bags

- # Chip or snack bags
- # Plastic shipping envelopes or bubble packaging
- Packaging labelled biodegradable or compostable
- Lumber or construction wrap
- Garbage bags (any colour)

- \* Packing chips, peanuts, foam noodles
- \* Blue or pink foam board insulation
- \* Squishy or flexible foam

### Here's what NOT to recycle









Any grocery, retail or trash plastic bag

**Bread bags** 

Dry cleaning bags

Fruit and vegetable bags (fresh/frozen)

Garden product bags (soil/mulch)

Newspaper bags

Outer wrap from paper towel, napkin and diaper packages

Outer wrap from cases of soda, juice and snacks

Zipper or stand-up pouches, bubble or cling wrap

Crinkle bags for cereal, pasta or snack bags

Outer wrap from meat or cheese products


